The HART Program is meant to serve as a bridge to other housing.



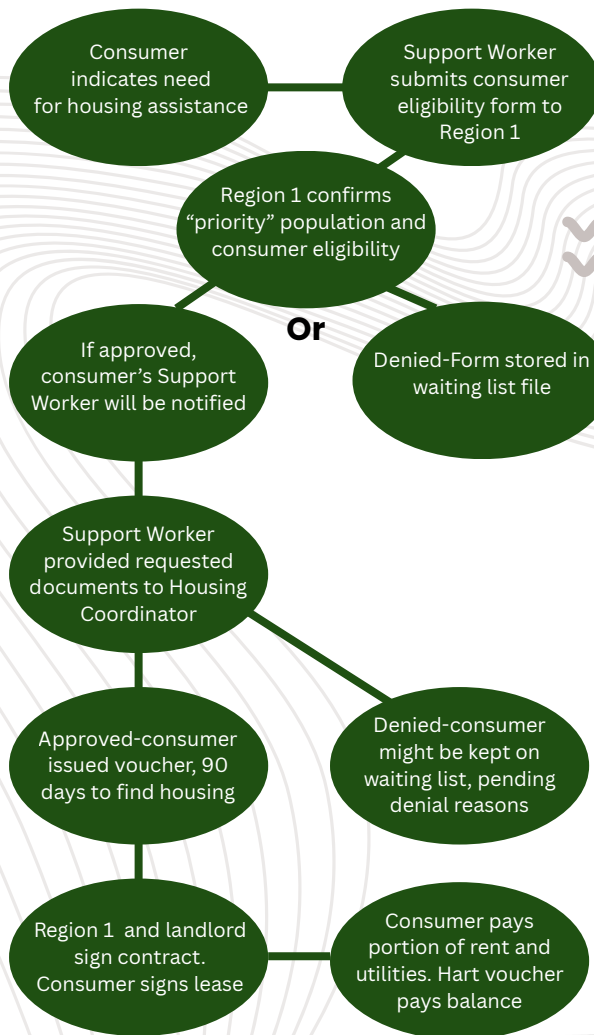

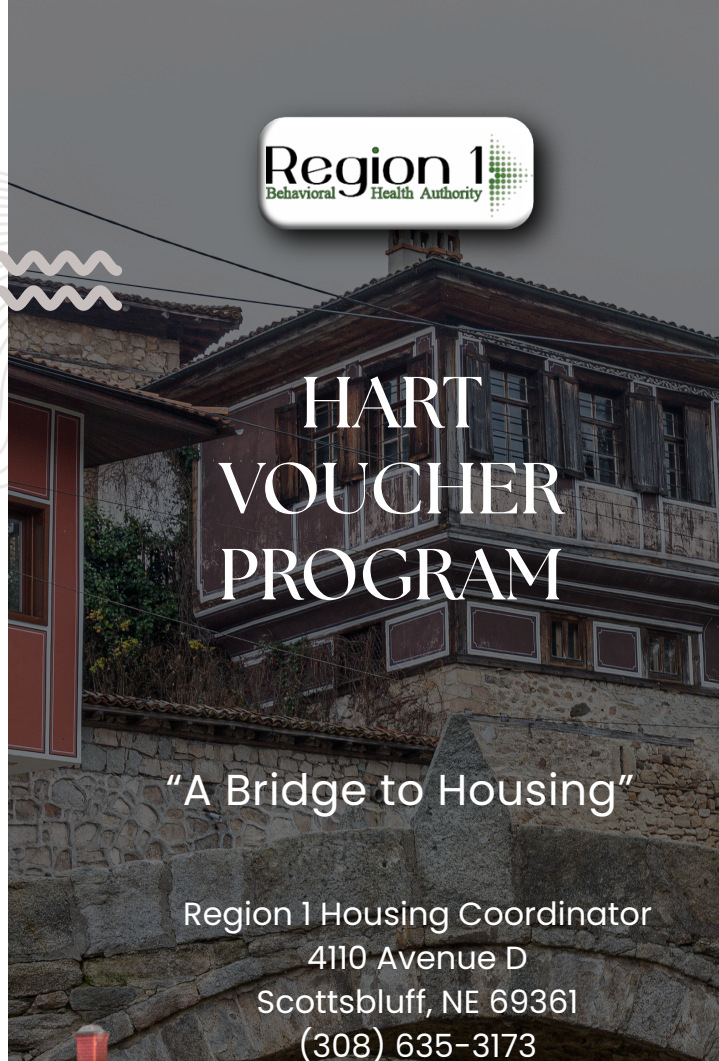

## What is HART?

The HART program was developed to help adults with a serious Mental Illness and/or Substance Use, find affordable housing in order to prevent homelessness. The program is primarily for persons who are being discharged from an inpatient placement and who have no place to live. The primary goal of the program is to create a bridge from the Housing Related Assistance Program to more long-term stabilized housing such as Section 8, Public Housing, or Independent Housing.

## HOW DOES SOMEONE QUALIFY FOR THE HART VOUCHER PROGRAM

**Applicants must be** at least 18 yrs old and meet the financial guidelines of the program

**Applicants must** have a diagnosed Mental Illness and/or Substance Use and a treatment plan with a goal of independent living.

**Applicants will** need to have a Support Worker, and be willing to work to achieve a goal of independent living.

**Applicants must** be registered or authorized to receive Region 1 BHA services.
