Crisis Incident Stress Management (CISM)

Course Description

Designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive, systemic and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum, the Group Crisis Intervention Course will prepare participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services. Fundamentals of Critical Incident Stress Management (CISM) will be outlined and participants will leave with the knowledge and tools to provide several group crisis interventions, specifically demobilization, defusings and CISD. The need for appropriate follow-up services and referrals when necessary will also be discussed.

This course is designed for anyone in the fields of Disaster Response, Emergency Services, Healthcare, Homeland Security, Mental Health, Military, and Traumatic Stress.



What is Critical Incident Stress Management?

CISM is a comprehensive service designed to assist emergency responders who have experienced unusual stress related to their work. CISM is interested in promoting a helpful response throughout the entire range of a crisis experience including the pre-crisis, acute crisis and post-crisis phases. Within the CISM program are seven core functions of response.
